Nova Scotia Education for Sustainable Development Working Group

In Nova Scotia, there is a need for individuals and organizations working on sustainable development to collaborate and coordinate activities, but currently there is no single group that meets to discuss and share resources around education for environmental, economic, and social sustainable development.

Through support from Environment Canada and in partnership with Learning for a Sustainable Future, the Nova Scotia Environmental Network and Genuine Progress Index (GPI) Atlantic have secured funding to create leadership and support for education for sustainable development across the province.

The Nova Scotia Education for Sustainable Development Working Group is currently being established to support systemic change within the formal, non-formal and informal education systems by working together with representatives from government, all three areas of education, non-governmental organizations, youth, industry, and academia.

We are seeking individuals and organizations currently working in - or who are interested in getting involved in - sustainable development and see a connection between sustainability issues and education for sustainable development. The first meeting of the Nova Scotia Education for Sustainable Development Working Group will be held on Tuesday, September 26, 2006.
